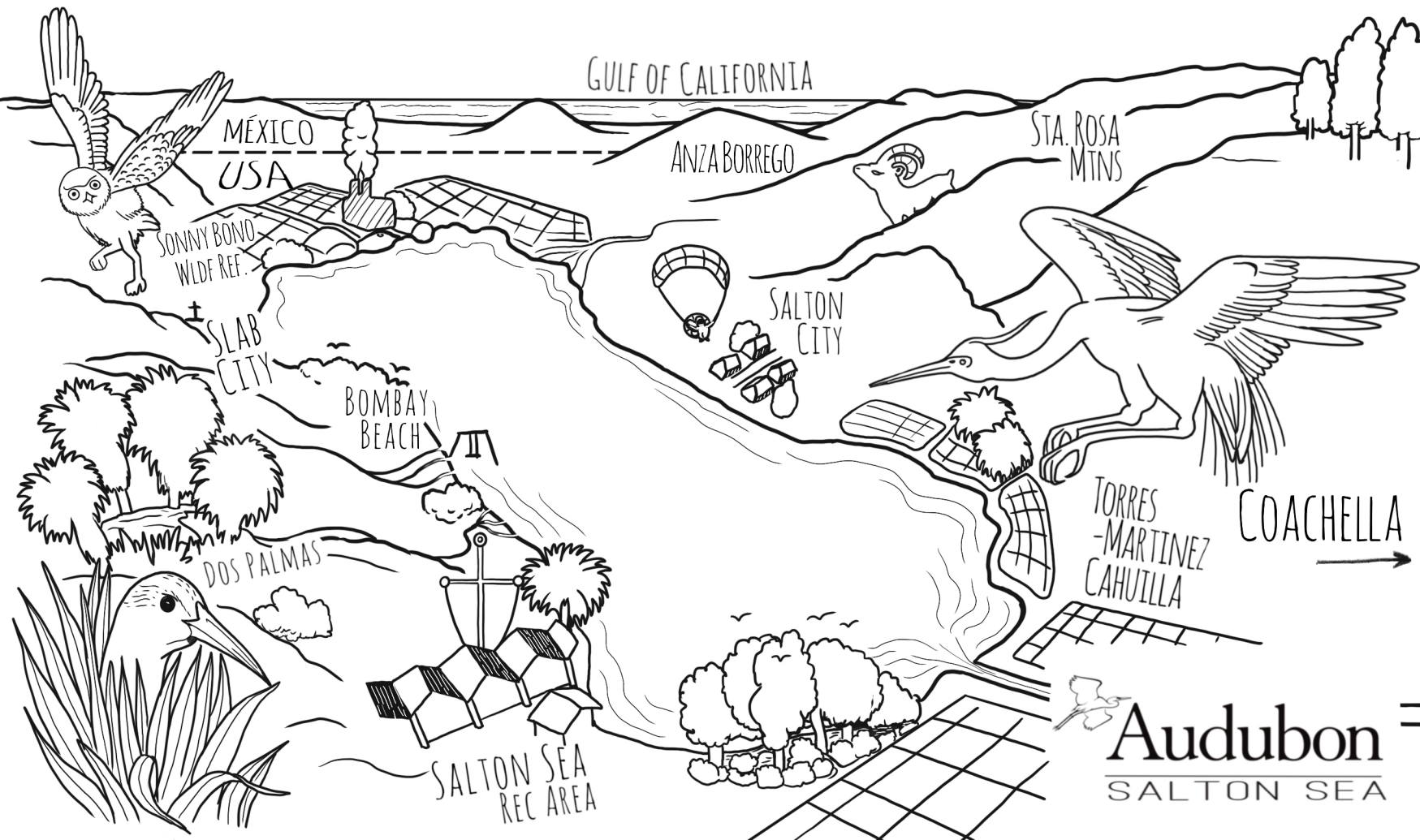

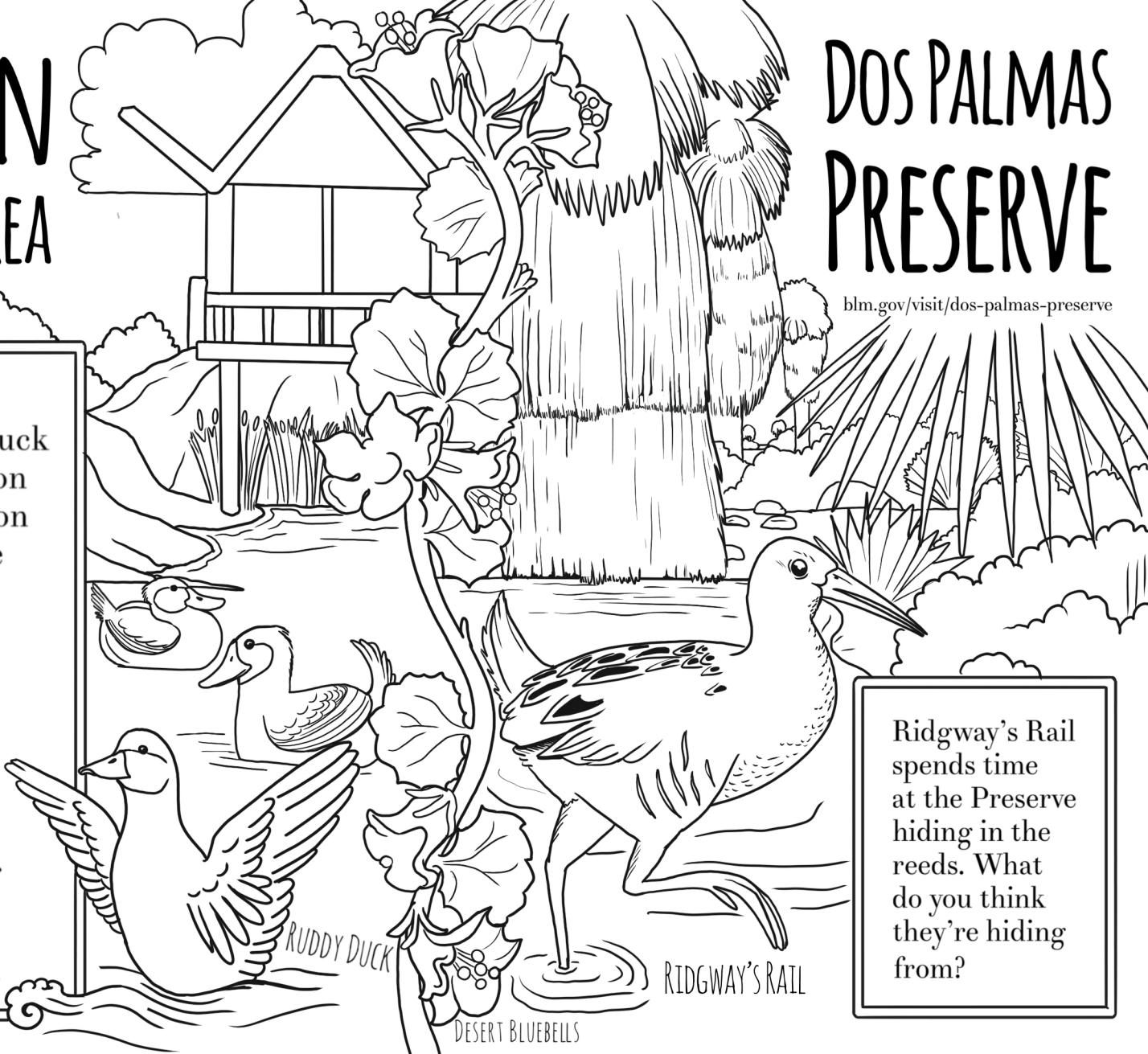

Ridgway's Rail spends time at the Preserve hiding in the reeds. What do you think they're hiding from?

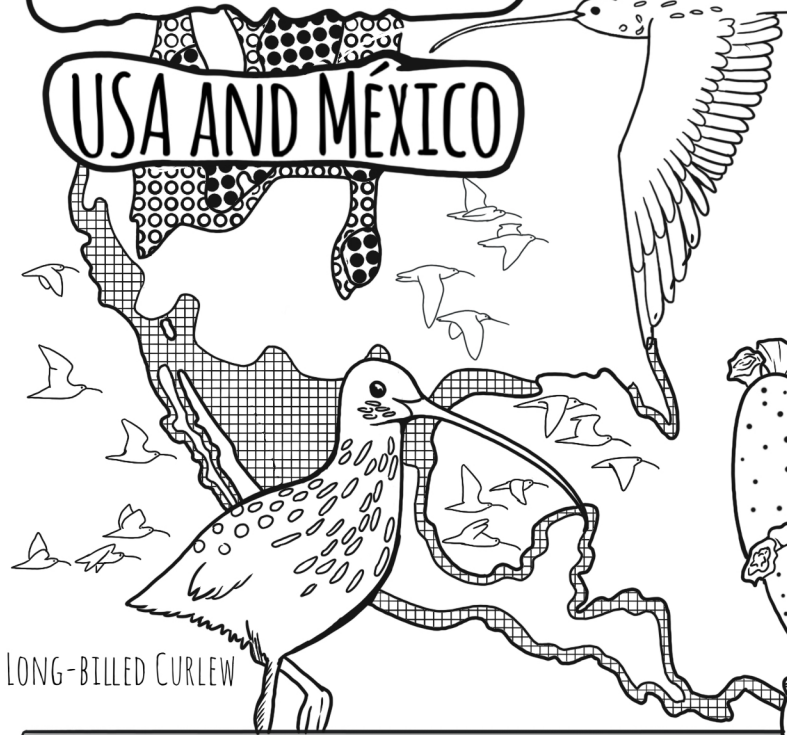

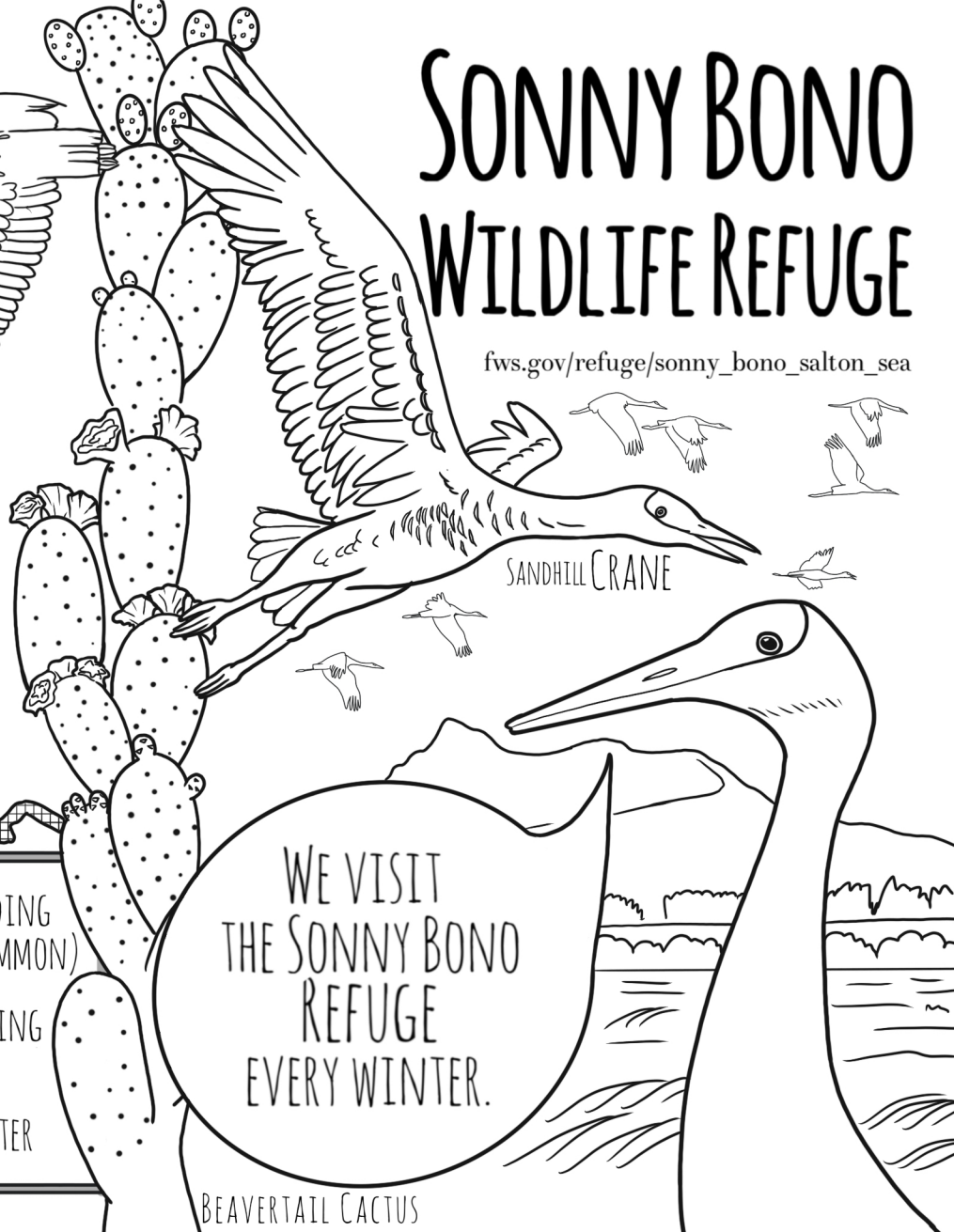
LONG-BILLED CURLEW

The Long-billed Curlew spends the summer in the center of the USA and travels to California and México during winter.

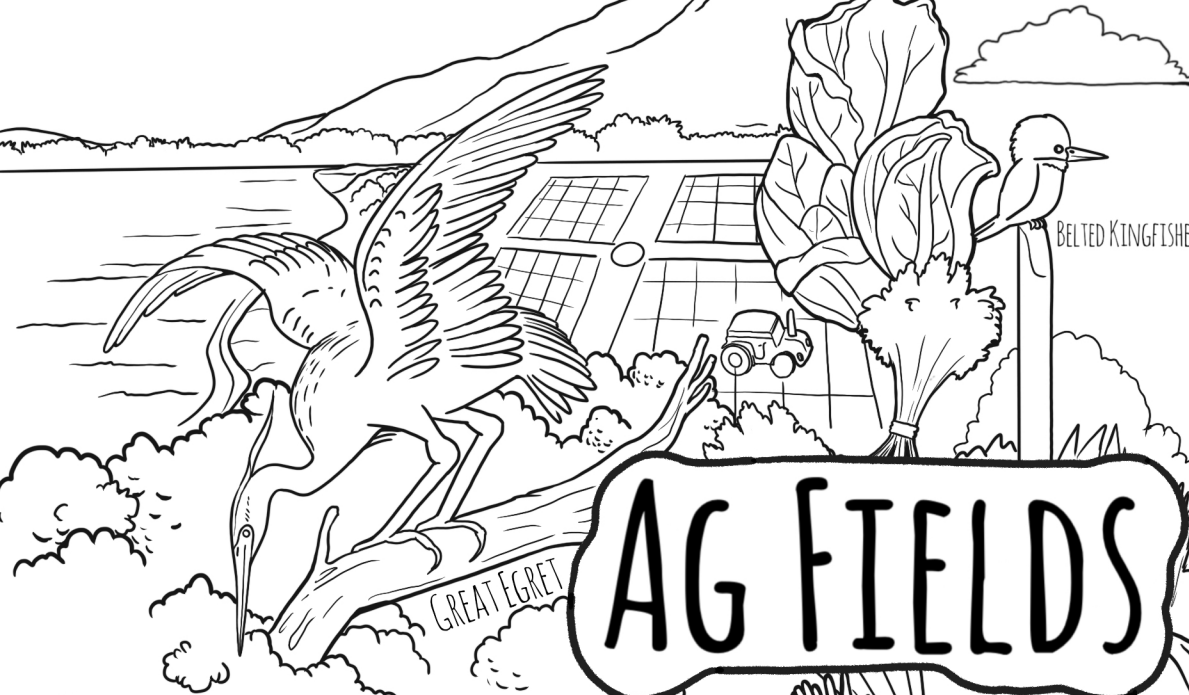

Agricultural canals near Brawley and Imperial are great spots for Burrowing Owls to make their cave-like homes.

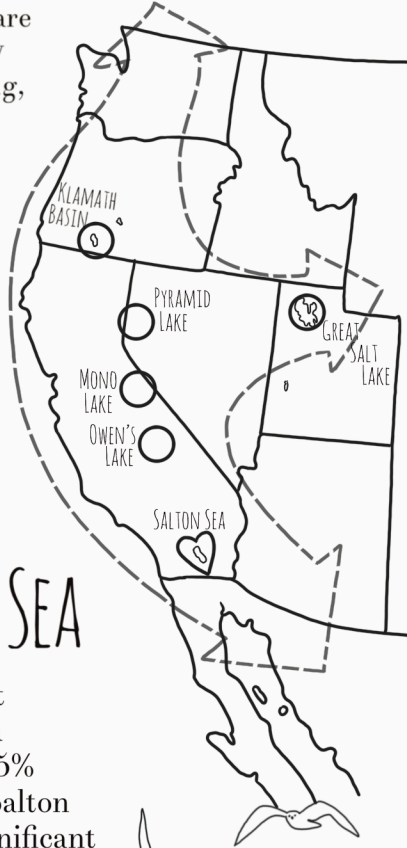
Egrets and herons like to make nests in some of the big groves of trees near agricultural fields in the Coachella Valley. That way, they have a good view!

Saline lakes across the Intermountain West are beacons for migratory birds during their long, yearly journeys between North and Central/South America.

- Major saline lakes in the Western USA.
- General bird migration routes along the Pacific Flyway

Of the wetlands that existed in California 150 years ago, only 5% remain today. The Salton Sea represents a significant portion of these precious few wildlife habitats.

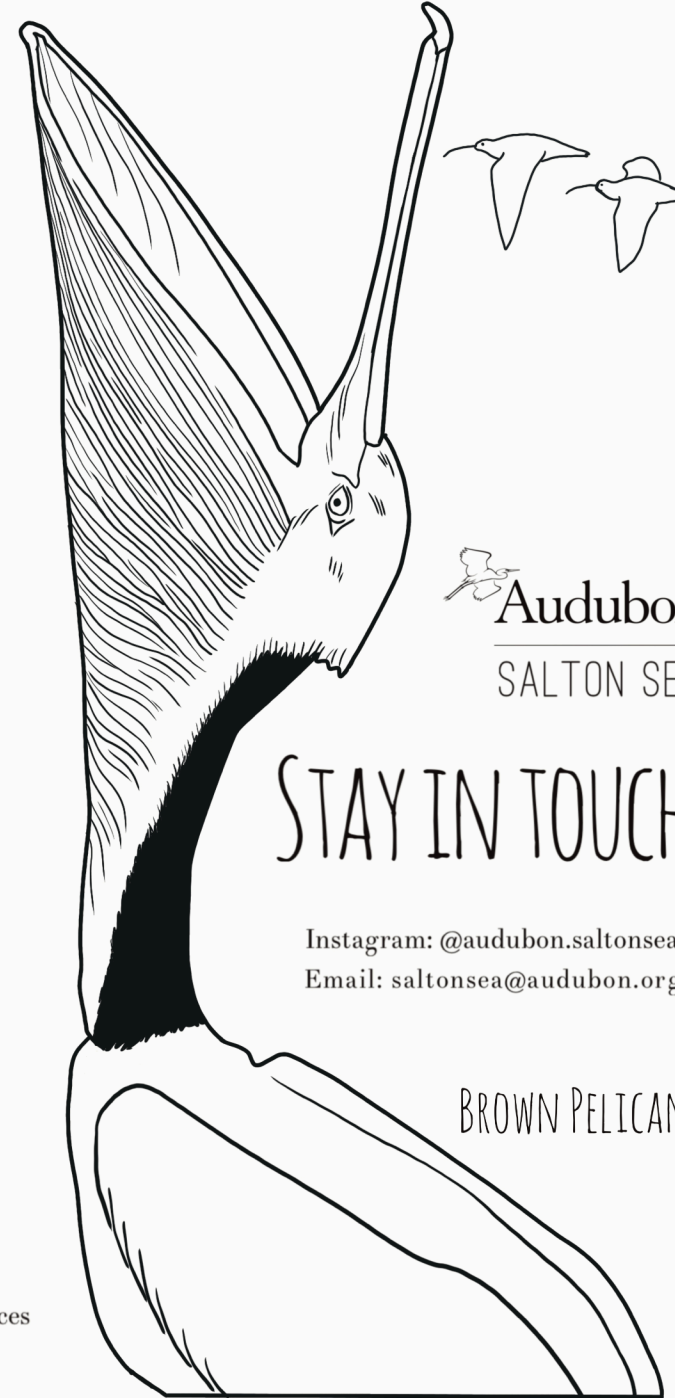
